The demand for healthcare services including skilled nursing will continue to grow for the next two decades.

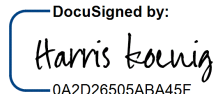
SNF beds have been and continue to be in short supply. While trying to place hospital patients into skilled nursing care is difficult at any time, placement is the most difficult in the winter months when hospitals must hold patients who do not need acute care many days longer because all the skilled nursing facilities are full.

When these facilities are full, which is a situation year round and worse in the winter months, it is like a dam that backs up the entire healthcare delivery system. Patients who need SNF care cannot access that level of care and those patients use hospital beds unnecessarily often for many days. Consequently, patients in need of hospital care can't be admitted. Hospital emergency departments clog and in turn ambulance response times grow.

This is the first new SNF project in the western section of the Inland Empire in many years. I would urge the City to approve it without delay. Please pass this letter along to the elected officials in the City of Jurupa Valley, so they too are aware of the need for the services to be offered by this project.
